

National Curriculum

At the end of the year all the children in year 6 will be sitting the new national primary curriculum SATS tests. There will be exams in mathematics, reading and SPAG (spelling, punctuation and grammar) which will be externally marked.

Reading

We encourage all children to read at home every day. Please ensure that your child is being read with or independently reading at home to develop your child's language skills. Reading records must be filled out, **using the guide stuck in your child's reading record**. We will keep a record of this. Please note that children will be in-charge of changing their own reading book once they have completed it.

Year 6 will receive multiple pieces of home learning **every Wednesday** and **due every Monday**, to aid with SATS preparation. Please note, the requirement is that children are reading daily to improve their fluency and understanding.

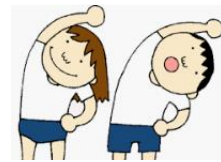
The school website has useful resources to support your child with their homework.

Crime and Punishment

English

This term, year 6 will be focusing their writing on two texts, *Suffragette: The battle for equality*, by David Roberts and *The Boy in the Tower*, by Polly Ho-Yen. The children will explore how a range of non-fiction texts are written and then write their own newspaper report and balanced argument. Later in the term, they will explore the use of language and emotions in order to write a letter and an extended narrative.

History

This term, year 6 will be exploring how Crime and Punishment have changed over time, in Britain. The children will take part in role play, debates and research. By the end, all children will write their own report explaining how crime and punishment has changed over time.

Mathematics

This term we will be converting between a range of measures and developing an awareness of different strategies in order to solve mathematical problems involving statistics, ratio and proportion. Children will continue to develop their understanding of arithmetic ready for SATS.
